Up-keeping / Housekeeping of above said areas TID admin building first and ground floor complete and Digital Hangar, compressor room (T), chamber of SDE (BSNL), CM(QS), chamber associated areas of QS office at first floor above Hangar-IV, M(QA) Office, Tube-well No. 02 & 04, TID gate, Security office and surrounding areas, its toilets, urinal pots, drinking water points, spittoons and complete and their floor with surrounding areas of these hangers as above.

All roads and corridors (black top, CC road, brick road, tiles road) and path way, pedestrian path of TED are covered in the contract.

Waste Disposal Management:

1. The contractor will teach and train his staff for the collection/disposal work.
2. The garbage will have to be disposed off at earmarked dustbin/disposal area every day.
3. Contractor is advised to collect the waste accordingly & dispose it off at dustbins near digital hangar/ET Plant/wherever area decided by EIC.

THE SCOPE OF WORK

Housekeeping/cleaning services should be provided round the clock on all days except holidays from Monday to Saturday so that all areas are neat & clean all the time. Working hours should be adjusted in such a manner that cleaning work in the morning should be completed in rooms/chambers (wherever required).

Contractor will arrange extra manpower for special VIP visits, if required and provide full support and cooperation during functions, seminars, VIP Visit etc. The Housekeeping staff has to do following activities for the entire TED, TID areas defined of all the departments, stores, canteen, various chambers, all corridors and all covered and open factory area.

1. Cleaning/Washing of all the toilets with sanitary items which will be provided by department, application of acids whenever required & spreading of phenyl in all the toilets once daily.
2. Removal of cobwebs once in a week from walls, roofs, corners, door & window etc. wherever it appears & seen.
3. Dusting, cleaning and moping of all the glass panes of windows, window grills, floors.
4. Removal of rain water from floors of hangers/offices accumulated due to leakage / seepage due to rainy season. The removal should be in such a way that most of the work complete in time.
5. For up-keeping of above areas stick brooms, duster, vim, acids, phenol, naphthalene balls and other materials will be supplied to the contractor as and when required from the department free of cost for which a stock register to be maintained by the contractor duly checked & approved by Sanitation in-charge.
6. Brooming by broom stick, fine cleaning with phool jharu all the floors once in a day is utmost necessary. Wet moping of all the chambers, stairs & first floor of TED Admin Building Corridor.
7. All internal road including berms & plinth protection & corridor of TED including the areas in between the corridors and building and disposal of collected rubbish like leafs, branch, waste paper polythene, plastic, thermocol etc.
8. The above areas mentioned in Sub-head-sites are exhaustive and elaborated to the best; however, the contract will cover complete area within the factory limit of factory area of TED & TID except where departmental sweepers are engaged at present.
9. If any area / department / hangar are being looked by any permanent employee/sweeper and if he retired/transferred, in such condition that area will be looked after by contractor.
10. Any type of choking in ladies and gents toilets from toilet sheet / gully trap to first manhole / inspection chamber will be the responsibility of the contractor.
11. Cleaning / dusting of name plates, door mats, firefighting equipments, computer systems, phones, doors, windows, furniture, window glasses, grills, curtains etc.
12. Cleaning of dust bins, waste paper baskets, cobwebs etc. and disposing off all collected refuse on daily basis. Collection of garbage from all the dustbins & garbage bins existing inside the premises and shall dispose off at the designated/decided area.
13. Cleaning and disinfecting all vitreous fixtures including toilet bowls, urinals, sinks, toilet Seats, containers etc. Brush thoroughly to include below water level and under rims including areas at hinges and cistern handles. Re-stock toiletries, which include liquid hand soap, toilet rolls, air fresheners, sanitary cubes, naphthalene balls in toilets, etc. after daily check-ups in the morning, afternoons and on call basis during daytime.
14. Cleaning of all open areas grass and thorny bushes between the building and boundary wall inside factory area through mechanical means JCB Machine including sweeping of roads, lawns, paths, where ever required as directed by the Engineer- In-charge.

15. It is the responsibility of contractor, to keep round the clock a house keeping staffs who is expert in the clearance of chocking of sinks, wash basins, floor traps, nahani traps, P-Traps, sewer chamber & sewer lines, the chocking shall be cleaned within 07 days after reporting the complaint. If there is any loss/inconvenience to ITI LTD, Naini factory area owing to chocking, appropriate penalties shall be imposed on the contractor.
16. All the garbage collected at the designated points spreaded over the inside factory area is to be lifted in trolley and bags as well as the general waste which does not require incineration should be cleared on daily basis to defined yards. In additions to this the cleaning of grass & thorny bushes points is also under the responsibility of Contractor.
17. Tools & Plant Like khapachi, angled sword, weeding knife etc. has to be arranged by Contractor.
18. Cleaning material and other required articles will be provided by EIC as per requirement. The value/cost of the same should not be included in rates quoted.
19. Contractor is also bind to do sanitation work wherever required by sanitation machines, Trolleys and other equipment, provided by company as per instructions of EIC.
20. Contractor is responsible for sweeping and cleaning where and whenever required other than above mentioned area & places in company also would be covered as per direction of EIC without paying any extra charge.
21. **If the above mentioned work is not found satisfactory as per defined area, the per day basis charge or as per instructions of EIC will be deducted on each failure occasion on the Contractor's bill.** If any place is found not upto the mark, suitable deductions will be made from the bills of contractor.
22. **During the execution of above work, if the behavior of any workmen deployed by contractor is not satisfactory/ improper/ misbehaving/inappropriate, then ITI shall have the rights to remove any deployed workmen/labour.**
23. If Contractor claim to any frivolous, malicious or baseless complaints/ allegations to ITI Officials and intent to hamper or delay the work process, ITI reserves the right to debarred/impose penalty as per decided by EIC to such contractors with immediate effect from participation in the present/ future tenders.
24. The sweeping work should be executed during "G" shift and there will be no work on weekly rests/holidays unless until specially asked in case of any VIP visit etc and for any extra work payments will not be made additionally.
25. **The contractor should submit his bill every month upto 10th day of respective due month. Payment will be released after satisfactory completion of work and certified by departmental head**
26. **Contractor will execute the above work as per schedule of cleaning & will have to maintain log book duly signed & verified by concern department & will have to final verified by EIC before submission of bills.**
27. **Contractor will have to declare the number of workmen will deploy by him including working time to execute the above work efficiently.**
28. **Maintaining logs and checklist before submitting of bill and it is responsibility of contractor to submit log book of detailed work done by him each month with complaint received at the office of the EIC. The log book of work done will be duly signed by various departments before submitting bill to the EIC as per format decided by site engineer.**

Note: All the garbage & waste generated through brooming & other activities as mentioned **above will be disposed off at location decided by EIC.**

In Addition to Scope of work pertaining to company: - Housekeeping inside ITI Factory area under this contract is very essential at various places during VIP visit. It will be fully responsibility to ensure neat & clean the area during VIP visit by deploying sufficient manpower to make visit successful without any extra charges.

Along with the routine housekeeping activities, the housekeeping staffs has to show his/her humanitarian concern towards employees, trainees and officers including all types of required help and services. Such services may be need based and might not been included in the general scope of work but they have to be provided by the housekeeping staff if needed.

From above schedule of cleaning, it is noted that contractor has to submit the work done register in every two month for verification of work done by him and bill will be accepted by EIC after verification of cleaning schedule log register.

Every workmen deputed by the contractor should maintain a register for keeping the daily record for sanitation & housekeeping services & should take signature from the concerned department for their comments.

1. Manpower: Any misconduct/misbehavior on the part of the manpower deployed by the Contractor will not be tolerated and such person will have to be replaced by the contractor at his own costs, risks and responsibilities immediately. Manpower must use mask to check infectious diseases.

2. The housekeeping staff deployed by the contractor shall not divulge or disclose any details of office, operational process, and technical know-how, security arrangement, administrative/organizational matters to any third person, as all of that are confidential and secret in nature. In the event of being found that the official secrecy has been disclosed and for the purpose of security arrangement and or for other purpose, it is desirable to remove the said person, the departmental head as per recommendation of site-in-charge has every right to remove the said person, immediately and responsibility if any to be borne by the contractor.

3. The contractor shall ensure that the person deployed are disciplined and conduct in office premises, be best suitable and is entailed on enforce in prohibition of consumption of alcoholic drinks, paan, smoking, loitering without work and engaging in gambling, satta or any immoral act.

Safety Rules & Regulations:

1. The contractor shall ensure proper safety of all the workmen, materials, plant and equipments belonging to him or to ITI Ltd. or to others working at or near the site. The contractor shall also be responsible for provision of all safety devices and safety equipment required both by the relevant legislation and the EIC as he may deem necessary.
2. The contractor shall provide safe working condition to all workmen and employees at the site including safe means of access, railing, stairs, scaffolding etc. The scaffolding shall be erected under the control and supervision of experienced and competent person. For erection, good and standard quality of material only shall be used by the contractor.
3. The contractor shall not interfere or disturb electric wiring and other electrical equipment belonging to the owner or other contractors under any circumstances, whatsoever, unless expressly permitted in writing by ITI Ltd.

General Instructions for Tenderer:

Intending tenders are advised to inspect and examine the site and its surroundings and satisfy themselves before submitting their tenders to the nature of the site. The nature of the site, the means of access to the site, the area defined they may require and in general shall themselves obtain all necessary information as to risk, contingencies and other circumstances which may influence or effect their tender. A tenderer shall be deemed to have full knowledge of the site whether he inspects it or not and no extra charges consequent on any misunderstanding or otherwise shall be allowed. Submission of tender by a tenderer implies that he has read this notice and all other contract documents has made himself aware of the scope and specifications of the work to be done and of conditions and rates at which stores, tools and plants etc. will be issued to him by the EIC and other factors having a bearing on the executions of the work.

Period of Contract: The contract period shall commence on the date of Commencement and shall remain for 01 year. The period is further extendable for a maximum period of 1 years (1 year at a time) on the same terms and conditions and the rates at which the contract is awarded will be valid throughout the contract and on claims whatsoever on account of increases other factors such as statutory payments, etc., shall be entertained and it will be the responsibility of the contractor to bear such other expenses.. Further any upward revision of Minimum Wages by the concerned authority amount may be revised accordingly.

Terms & Conditions

1. In case bidder or executer is a sub-contractor of registered contractor, copy of MOU/ agreement with principal bidder is required to submit along with tender documents.
2. Contractor have to ensure workmen insurance as applicable before commencement of work with a valid period effective from day one of the contract lasting till last date of completion of work order.
3. Contractors will be responsible for fulfilling the Laws of Minimum wages Act & other statutory regulations regarding manpower employed by him. Any liability arising out of non-compliance of rules will be recovered from him.
4. Time is the essence of the contract & the contractor will be fully responsible for the same. He has to mobilize the sufficient manpower to complete the work otherwise appropriate compensation for delay will be levied, if the delay caused will be accounted in contractor part penalty will be deducted from the bill.
5. Income-tax as applicable will be deducted from the bill of the contractor as per rules.
6. Proof of registration for statutory obligations i.e.; PF, ESI, EDLI etc. should be submitted to ITI Ltd. along with the bid.
7. For all contracts PF, ESI, EDLI etc. has to be strictly borne by contractors.
8. **Contractor will have to quote in their profit percentage & corresponding amount over to S.No. (1) Value SOQ.**
9. **MSME registered vendor will be exempted from tender fee & EMD and participants would have to submit supporting documents that whether they are MSME registered & others.**
10. The general terms & conditions normally applicable for civil works will be applicable to the contract also & binding on the contractor.
11. Security deposit @ **03%** will be deducted from the awarded work value/every running bill for the period of **01 year**.
12. Water charges will be deducted @ **1%** of work value.
13. For ITI working contractor the cost of tender executed by them, 50% NIT value being called for, and 100% NIT value for external contractor with similar nature of work/labour supply/labour oriented work during **last five years**.
14. The amount of loss due to negligence or otherwise will be recoverable from the contractor.
15. In case of any dispute, the decision of Unit Head, ITI Limited, Naini Allahabad-211010 will be final and binding to both the parties.
16. Registered contractors will be preferred for issue of work orders.
17. In every bill, contractor has to be submit an undertaking that no labour payment is pending.
18. 100% labour payment will be considered of work value for payment of PF, ESI and EDLI etc. in labour oriented work.
19. In future, after your written consent a “repeat order” can also be given up to same Magnitude of work order value on same rate, ‘Terms & Conditions’ of work order and it is the full discretion of ITI’s management.
20. The document submitted by bidder should be clear, neat and visible to readable.
21. Tax Deductions will be as per prevailing applicable Government Rules and quote rates including GST.

GENERAL TERMS:

LABOUR:

1. The contractor shall employ labour in sufficient numbers either directly or through sub-contractor, where such subletting is permitted, to maintain the required rate of progress and of quality to ensure workmanship of the degree specified in the contract and to the satisfaction of the Engineer-In-Charge. The contractor shall not employ in connection with the works any person who has not completed his Seventeenth years of age.

1.1.

(a) In this connection, the contractor shall be responsible for the implementation of the U.P. Factory Rules 1969 regarding employment of child/adolescent labour and in default of compliance with any of the provisions of the said rules, he shall indemnify the Company from any damages, penalties, fines, claims or any other cause of action against the Company on account of any action by the competent government authority or person.

(b) The contractor shall not employ any person below the age of 18 years under the law and if any child/adolescent labour who is above the age of 18 years but not completed 18 years, a certificate of fitness shall be obtained by the contractor from the CMO, Naini, without which the contractor shall be liable for action as per provisions under the law.

1.2. The contractor shall pay to labour employed by him directly to bank accounts or through sub-contractor wages not less than fair wages as defined in the Contractor's Labour Regulations.

1.3. The contractor shall in respect of labour employed by him either directly or through sub-contractor comply with or cause to be complied with the Contractor's Labour Regulations in regards to all matters provided therein.

1.4. The contractor shall comply with the provisions of Payment of wages Act 1936, Minimum wages Act 1947, Employer's Liability Act 1933, Workmen's Compensation Act 1923, Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 or any modifications there of or any other law relating thereto and rules made there under from time to time.

1.5. The contractor shall be liable to pay his contribution & the employee's contribution to the State Insurance Scheme/FP/PF in respect of all labour employed by him for the execution of the contract in accordance with the provisions or "The Employees State Insurance Act 1948"/Provident Fund Act/'Family Pension Act' as amended from time to time. In case the contractor fails to submit full details of his account of labour employed and the contribution payable, the Engineer-In-Charge shall recover from the running bills of the contractor an amount as assessed by him. The amount so recovered shall be Employees State Insurance.

1.6. The Engineer-In-Charge shall, on a report having been made by an Inspecting officer as defined in the contractor's labour regulations, have the power to deduct from the moneys due to the contractor any sum required for making good. The loss suffered by a worker or workers by reason of non-fulfillment of the conditions of the contract for the benefit of workers, non-payment of wages of deductions made from his or their wages which are not justified by the terms of the contractor non-observance of the said Contractors Labour Regulations.

1.7. The contractor shall indemnify the trust against any payments to be made under and for observance of the regulations aforesaid without prejudice to his right to claim indemnity from sub-contractor.

1.8. a. In the event of the contractor committing a default or breach of any of the provisions of the aforesaid contractor's labour regulations as amended from time to time or furnishing any information or submitting or filling any Form/Register/Slip under the provisions of these Regulations which is materially incorrect then on the report of the Inspecting Officers as defined in the Contractor's Labour Regulation, the contractor shall without prejudice to any other liability pay to the Company a sum not

exceeding Rs. 15,000/- as liquidated damages for every default, breach or furnishing, making submitting, filling materially incorrect statements as may be fixed by the Engineer-In-Charge. And in the event of the contractor's default continuing in this respect, the liquidated damages may be enhanced to Rs. 500/- per day for each day of default subject to maximum of **10%** of the estimated cost of the works/supply as per tender. The Engineer-In-Charge shall deduct such amount from bills or security deposit of the contractor and credit the same to the welfare fund constituted under Regulations. The decision of the Engineer- in-charge in this respect shall be final and binding.

b. If the contractor fails to maintain the required progress/supply or to complete the work before the contract or extended date of completion, he shall, without prejudice to any other right or remedy available under the law to the Government on account of such breach, pay as agreed compensation the amount calculated at the rates stipulated below as the Dy. Chief Engineer (whose decision in writing shall be final and binding) may decide on the amount of tendered value of the work for every completed day / month (as applicable) that the progress remains below that specified or that the work/supply remains incomplete.

i) Compensation for delay of work - @ **1.5%** per month of delay to be computed on per day basis.

Provided always that the total amount of compensation for delay to be paid under the condition shall not exceed **10%** of the Tendered value of work or of the tendered value of item or group of items of work for which a separate period of completion is originally given.

The amount of compensation may be adjusted or set off against any sum payable to the contractor under this or any other contract with the Government. In case, the contractor does not achieve a particular milestone mentioned in Schedule or the re-scheduled milestone (s) the amount shown against the milestone shall be withheld to be adjusted against the compensation levied at the final grant of Extension of time. With holding of this amount of failure to achieve a milestone shall be automatic without any notice to the contractor. However, if the contractor catches up with the progress of work/supply on the subsequent milestone (s), the withheld amount shall be released. In case of the contractor fails to make up for the delay in subsequent milestone(s) amount mentioned against each milestone missed subsequently also shall be withheld. However, no interest, whatsoever shall be payable on such withheld amount.

1.9. MODEL RULES FOR LABOUR WELFARE:

The contractor shall at his own expense comply with or cause to be complied with Model Rules for labour welfare as appended to these conditions or rules framed by Government from time to time for the protection of health and for making sanitary arrangements for workers employed directly or indirectly on the works. In case the contractor fails to make arrangements as aforesaid, the Engineer-In-Charge shall be entitled to do so and recover the cost thereof from the contractor.

1.10. SAFETY CODE:

i) The contractor shall at his own expense arrange for the safety provisions as appended to these conditions or as required by the Engineer-In-Charge, in respect of all labour directly or indirectly employed for performance of the works and shall provide all facilities in connection therewith. In case, the contractor fails to make arrangements and provide necessary facilities as aforesaid, the Engineer-In-Charge shall be entitled to do so and recover the cost thereof from the contractor.

ii) Failure to comply with Model Rules for Labour Welfare Safety Code or the provisions relating to report on accidents of workers shall make contractor liable to pay to the Company as liquidated damages an amount not exceeding **Rs. 50,000/-** for each default or materially incorrect statement. The decision of the Engineer-In-Charge in such matters based on reports from the Inspecting officers as defined in the Contractor's Labour Regulation as appended to these conditions shall be final and binding and deduction for recovery of such liquidated damages may be made from any amount payable to the contractor.

ADMISSION TO SITE:

2. The contractor shall not be permitted to enter on (other than for inspection purpose) or take possession of the site until instructed to do so by the Engineer-In-Charge in writing. The portion of the site to be occupied by the contractor shall be defined and/or marked on the site failing which these shall be indicated by the Engineer-In-Charge at the site and the contractor shall on no account be allowed to extend his operations beyond these areas:

2.1. The contractor shall provide, if necessary or if required on the site, all temporary access thereto and shall alter adapt, and maintain the same as required from time to time and shall take up and clear them away as and when no longer required and as and when ordered by the Engineer-In-Charge and make good all damage done to the site.

NUISANCE:

2.2. The contractor shall not at any time do, cause or permit any nuisance on the site or do anything which shall cause unnecessary disturbance or inconvenience to owners, tenants or occupiers of other properties near the site and to the public generally.

2.4 - NOTICE OF COMMENCEMENT:

The contractor shall, within SEVEN days of commencement of the work, furnish in writing to the Inspecting Officer of the area concerned the following information:

- (a) Name and situation of the work.
- (b) Contractor's name and address.
- (c) Particulars of the Department for which the work is undertaken.
- (d) Name and Address of sub-contractors as and when they are appointed.
- (e) Commencement and probable duration of the work.
- (f) Number of workers employed and likely to be employed.
- (g) "Fair Wages" for different categories of workers.

3. (i) Number of hours of work which shall constitute a normal working day. The number of hours which shall constitute a normal working day for an adult shall be NINE hours. The working day of an adult worker shall be so arranged that inclusive of intervals, if any, for rest it shall not spread over more than twelve hours on any day. When an adult worker is made to work for more than NINE hours on any day or for more than FORTY EIGHT hours in any week he shall, in respect of overtime work, be paid wages at double the ordinary rate of wages.

(ii) **Weekly day of rest:** Every worker shall be given a weekly day of rest which shall be fixed and notified at least TEN days in advance. A worker shall not be required or allowed to work on the weekly rest day unless he has or will have a substituted rest day on one of the five days immediately before or after the rest day. Provided that no substitution shall be made which will result in the worker working for more than ten days consecutively without a rest day for a whole day. Where in accordance with the foregoing provisions a worker works on the rest day and has been given a substituted rest day he shall be paid wages for the work done on the weekly rest day at the overtime rate of wages.

NOTE: The expression ordinary rate of wages means the fair wages the worker is entitled to.

4. Display of notice regarding wages, weekly Day of Rest etc.:

The contractor shall before he commences his work on contract, display and correctly maintain in a clean and legible condition in conspicuous places on the works, notices in the local Indian Language, spoken by majority of workers, giving the rate of fair wages, the hours of work for which such wages are payable, the weekly rest days workers are entitled to and name and address of the Inspecting Officer. The Contractor shall send a copy each of such notice to the Inspecting Officers.

5. Fixation of Wage Periods:

The Contractor shall fix wage periods in respect of which wages shall be payable. No wage period shall normally exceed **one week**.

6. Payment of Wages:

(i) Wages due to every worker shall be paid to him direct into account. All wages shall be paid in current currency.

(iii) When employment of any worker is terminated by or on behalf of the contractor, the wages earned by him shall be paid before expiry of the day succeeding the one in which his employment is terminated.

(iv) Payment of wages shall be made at the work site on a working day except when the work is completed before expiry of the wage period, in which case final payment shall be made at the work site within 48 hours of the last working day and during normal working time.

NOTE: The term "Working Day" means a day on which, the labour is employed and the work is in progress.

7. Register of workmen:

A Register/muster roll of workmen shall be maintained for these regulations and kept at the work site or as near to it as possible and the relevant particulars of every workman shall be entered therein within THREE days of his employment.

8. Employment Card:

The contractor shall issue an employment card in the Form appended to these regulations to each worker on the day of work or entry into his employment. If a worker has already any such card with him issued by the previous employer, the contractor shall merely endorse that Employment Card with relevant entries. On termination of employment, the Employment Card shall again be endorsed by the Contractor and returned to the worker.

9. Register of wages etc.:

(i) A Register of wages-cum-Muster Roll will provide at the time of contract issued to these regulations shall be maintained and kept at the work site or as near to it as possible.

(ii) A wage slip in any form (as convenient) to these regulations shall be issued to every worker employed by the contractor at least a day prior to disbursement of wages.

10. Register of Accidents: The Contractor shall maintain a register of accidents in such form as may be convenient at the work place but the same shall include the following particulars:

- (a)** Full particulars of the labourers who met with accident.
- (b)** Rate of wages.
- (c)** Sex.
- (d)** Age.
- (e)** Nature of accident and cause of accident.
- (f)** Time and date of accident.
- (g)** Date and time when admitted in hospital.
- (h)** Date of discharge from the hospital.
- (i)** Period of treatment and result of treatment.
- (j)** Percentage of loss of earning capacity and disability as assessed by medical officer.
- (k)** Claim required to be paid under workmen's Compensation Act.
- (l)** Date of payment of compensation.

(m) Amount paid with details of the person to whom the same was paid.

(n) Authority by which the compensation was assessed.

(o) Remarks.

11. Preservation of Registers: The register of workmen and the Register of Wages-cum-Muster Roll required to be maintained under these Regulations shall be preserved for 03 years after the date on which the last entry is made therein.

12. Enforcement: The Inspecting Officer shall either on his own motion or in a complaint received by him carry out investigations, & send a report to the Engineer-In-Charge specifying the amounts representing workers dues and amount of penalty to be imposed on the Contractor for breach of these Regulations, that have to be recovered from the Contractor, indicating full details of the recoveries proposed and the reasons therefore. It shall be obligatory on the part of the Engineer-In-Charge on receipt of such a report to deduct such amounts from payments due to the contractor.

13. Disposal of amounts recovered from the Contractor: The Engineer-In-Charge shall arrange payment of workers concerned within Forty Five days from receipt of a report from the Inspecting Officer except in cases where the Contractor had made an appeal under Regulation-1 of these Regulations. In cases where there is an appeal, payment of workers dues would be arranged by the Engineer-In-Charge, wherever such payment arise, within Thirty days from the date of receipt of the decision of the Deputy Labour Commissioner (D.L.C.).

14. Welfare Fund: All moneys that are recovered by the Engineer-In-Charge by way of workers dues which could not be disbursed to workers within the time-limit prescribed above, due to reasons such as whereabouts of workers not being known, death of a worker, etc. and also amounts recovered as penalty, shall be credited to a Fund to be kept under the custody of the Company for such benefit and welfare of workmen employed by Contractors.

15. Appeal against decision of Inspecting Officer: Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Inspecting Officer may appeal against such decision to D.L.C. concerned within Thirty days from the date of the decision, forwarding simultaneously a copy of his appeal to the Engineer-In-Charge. The decision of the D.L.C. shall be final and binding upon the contractor and the workmen.

16. REPRESENTATION OF PARTIES:

(i) A workmen shall be entitled to be represented in any investigation or inquiry under these Regulations. An officer of a registered trade union of which he is a member or by an officer of a Federation of trade unions to which the said trade union is affiliated or where the workmen is not a member of any registered trade union, by an officer of a registered trade union, connected with, or by any other workmen employed in the industry in which the worker is employed.

(ii) A contractor shall be entitled to be a representative in any investigations or enquiry under these Regulations by an officer of an association of contractors of which he is a member or by an officer of a Federations of associations of contractors to which the said associations is affiliated or where the Contractor is not a member of any association of contractors, by an officer of association of employers, connected with, or by any other employer engaged in the industry in which the contractor is engaged.

(iii) No party shall be entitled to be represented by a legal practitioner in any investigation or enquiry under these Regulations.

18. Inspection of Books and other Documents: The Contractor shall allow inspection of the Registers and other documents prescribed under these Regulations by Inspecting Officers and the Engineer-in-Charge or his authorized representative at any time and by the worker or his agent on receipt of due notice at a convenient time.

19. Interpretation, etc.: On any question as to the application, interpretation or effect of these Regulations, the decision of the Chief Labour Commissioner or Deputy Chief Labour Commissioner (State/Central) shall be final and binding.

20. Amendments: Central Government may, from time to time, add to or amend these Regulations and issue such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper implementation of these Regulations or for the purpose of removing any difficulty which may arise in the administration thereof.

21. Contract Labour (Abolition & Regulation) Act, 1972: All obligations arising under this contract consequent on the passing of the Contract Labour (Abolition & Regulation) Act, 1972 shall be fulfilled by the Contractor and the Company shall have the right to be indemnified by the Contractor in case of any claim, loss, cause of action by any third party on account of the application of the said Act to this contract.

22. (a) Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952: All the obligations arising under this contract consequent on the passing of Employees Provident Fund, Act 1952 shall be fulfilled by the Contractor and the Company shall have the right to be indemnified by the Contractor in case of any claim, loss, cause of action by any third party on account of the application of the said Act to this contract.

(b) Family Pension: All the obligations arising under this contract consequent on the passing of Family Pension shall be fulfilled by the Contractor and the Company shall have the right to be indemnified by the Contractor in case of any claim, loss, cause of action by any third party on account of the application of the said provisions to this contract.

MODEL RULES FOR LABOUR WELFARE

1- Definitions:

(a) 'Workplace' means a place at which, on an average, ten or more workers are employed.

(b) 'Large Workplace' means a place at which, on an average, 100 or more workers are employed.

2- First Aid: At every workplace, there shall be maintained in a readily accessible place first-aid appliance including an adequate supply of sterilized dressings and sterilized cotton wool as prescribed in the Factory Rules of the State in which the work is carried on. The appliances shall be kept in good order and, in large workplaces; they shall be placed under the charge of a responsible person who shall be readily available during working hours.

3- Accommodation for Labour : The contractor shall during the progress of the works provide, erect and maintain necessary temporary living accommodation and ancillary facilities for labour at his own expense and to standards and scales as approved by the Engineer-In-Charge.

4- Amendments: Government may, from time to time, add to or amend these Rules and Issue such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper implementation of these Rules or for the purpose of removing any difficulty which arises for administration thereof.

5. All necessary personal safety equipment as considered adequate by the Engineer-In-Charge shall be available for use of persons employed on the site and maintained in a condition suitable for immediate use and the contractor shall take adequate steps to ensure proper use of equipment by those concerned.

(a) Those engaged in handling any materials which is injurious to eyes shall be provided with protective goggles.

6. When work is done near any place where there is risk of drowning all necessary equipment shall be provided and kept ready for use and all necessary steps for prompt rescue of any person in danger and adequate provision made for prompt first aid treatment of all injuries likely to be sustained during the course of the work.

7. To ensure effective enforcement of the rules and regulations relating to safety precautions, arrangements made by the contractor shall be open to inspection by the Engineer-In-Charge or his representatives and the inspecting officers as defined in the Contractor's Labour Regulation.
