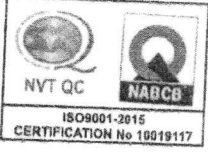

INTRODUCTION

ITI Limited is a Central Public Sector Unit (CPSU) of Department of Telecom, Govt. of India, engaged in delivering large turnkey projects, in the field of IT/Telecom/networking and working as Master System Integrator for Planning, Design, Supply, Installation, commissioning and maintenance of pan India Networks and other IT and Telecom related infrastructure and services.

DoT / BBNL has established nationwide broadband network to provide data services at Gram Panchayat level. ITI vision is to extend the data services even to remotest villages in India and contribute towards Digital India mission. In Himachal Pradesh there is existing BharatNet network as part of phase-1. This network is being upgraded in amended BharatNet project by ITIL. For the network upgradation it is required to ascertain the health of the existing laid OFC (24F) of approximately 793 RKM connecting 258 GPs. The scope of the work in this tender is to check end to end health of the laid 24F OFC which is approximately 60% underground and 40% aerial. The health report is to be submitted as per the detailed technical instructions given in the scope of work

- b) **Time schedule for completion of work at site:** Bidder shall complete the required work block wise within 75 days from date of issue of LOI.
- c) Bidder shall commence the work immediately after issuance of WO.
- d) Bidder shall depute sufficient manpower/labor to carry out the work at GP(s)/Block(s) simultaneously.

- i. Bidder /Firms who fulfill the requirements as mentioned in this tender document shall be eligible to apply.
- ii. Bidder can upload documents in the form of PDF format only.
- iii. Bidder must ensure to quote rate items separately as per format given in **Financial Bid** as per **ANNEXURE--XIII**.
- iv. If any cell is left blank and no rate is quoted by the bidder, Rate of such items shall be treated as rupees "0" (ZERO) or rejected for Bidding.
- v. The eligibility documents shall be opened first for technical bid on due date and time as mentioned above. Financial evaluation of Bidders/Firms who qualified in technical evaluation will be opened on the later date.
- vi. ITI Limited reserves the right to reject the tender without assigning any reason thereof.
- vii. The rates will be submitted as per the financial bid (**ANNEXURE-XIII**). Financial bid in another format shall be liable to be rejected. In case, if the bidders do not submit any tender relevant document as mentioned in Technical Bid, his bid will be outright rejected and bid will not be considered for further evaluation.
- viii. **GOVERNMENT LAW:** - All suits shall be instituted in a court of competent jurisdiction at Delhi and in case of arbitration; the Indian Arbitration Conciliation Act 1996 is applicable. Tender documents shall be filled, signed and submitted/Uploaded in original. The submitted Tender shall consist of the following:
- ix. Any increase in taxes and other statutory duties/levies, after the expiry of the delivery date shall be to the supplier's account. However, benefit of any decrease in these taxes/duties shall be passed on to the Purchaser by the supplier. The total price is to be adjusted (by reducing the basic price) with increased duties and taxes as per price mentioned in PO/Tender.

Note:

4. EARNEST MONEY DEPOSIT (EMD)

As specified in the tender document EMD shall be payable with the bid. EMD is to be remain valid for a period of 45 days beyond the final bid validity period.

Micro, small Enterprises (MSE) Organizations, are exempted from EMD and tender fee. Such firms should produce proof of registration in own name with MSME and NSIC and should provide “**BID SECURITY DECLARATION FORM**” as **ANNEXURE-II**.

This shall be paid well in advance of tender submission time through ewizard Payment gateway or in favor of ITI Ltd, N.S. Unit, Bangalore-560016. The Bank details is attached as ANNEXURE-XV. Proof/receipt of payment of cost of EMD to be uploaded.

Note: The Bank Guarantee Details /Payment details shall be indicated on the letter head along with a scanned copy of the above payment must be uploaded during tender submission. Failure to furnish relevant document of EMD amount may lead to rejection of the bid.

The EMD may be forfeited:

- If a bidder withdraws the bid after bid opening during the period of validity.
- The information provided by the bidder is found to be false/forged document have been provided. This will entail black listing of the -bidder also.

IN CASE L1 BACKS OUT: In case The bidder withdraws during the technical evaluation and before financial bid opening, still the technical bid of such bidder will be evaluated and in case such bid in technically suitable and happens to be L-1, then also the tender must be discharged and EMD of the bidder will be forfeited.

Return of Earnest Money deposit: No interest shall be allowed on the Earnest Money deposit by the Bidder. The earnest money of the unsuccessful bidder will be refunded on their request after the finalization of the contract.

EMD shall be forfeited if the Bidder fails to submit the Performance Bank Guarantee within 30 Days EMD of successful bidder shall be returned after submission of performance bank guarantee.

5. PERFORMANCES CUM WARRANTY BOND:

- (i) Selected bidder will submit the PBG of 5% of work value . Validity of PBG will be six months+ 60 days from date of issue of LOI.
- (ii) PBG must be furnished within 15 days from the date of issue of LOI. WO will be issued after submission of PBG.
- (iii) If the PBG validity is going to expire before completion of project, it will be obligatory on bidder part to extend the PBG validity period accordingly.
- (iv) No interest shall be allowed on the PBG.

6. LIQUIDITY DAMAGES (LD) CLAUSE:

LD shall be as per the following clauses:

- a) LD will be 0.5% per week or part thereof, up to a maximum/capped at 10% of the delayed services value.
- b) The LD will not be imposed on the bidder for the delay on part of ITIL.

Planning and Preparation

1. BSNL issued SOP for survey of brown field network to be followed (annexed)
2. Site Access and Logistics
 - Coordinate access to all relevant network locations.
 - Develop a detailed survey schedule.
 - Arrange for transportation and necessary on-site support.
3. Arrange for required number of splicing machines, additional 6F OFC as per requirement, OTDR, power meter and light source, 24 F OFC jointing kit with operating teams for these equipment.
4. GPS tagged photography of GPs, break location, every joint chambers, temporary restored portion. Videography of entire route.

Field Survey and Testing

1. Visual Inspection
 - Conduct visual inspection of fiber optic cables, conduits, closures, and termination points.
 - Identify physical damage, stress, improper installation, or environmental hazards.
 - Document physical condition and location of components.
2. Fiber Identification and Tracing (Using FRT)
 - Use the Fiber Ranger Tool (FRT) to identify and trace fiber strands.
 - Verify connectivity and labeling against existing records (L14 diagrams)
 - Document actual fiber routing and connections.
3. Optical Loss Testing (Using Power Meter and light source)

 - Optical loss measurement data, List of identified faults.
 - Task will not be considered complete till IE and BSNL gives work order for the unserviceable and temporarily restored OFC length.

Annexure -IA

Survey &BoQ Validation (BSNL SOP)

(Only brown field survey portion is applicable)

1. Context

The rollout of the Amended BharatNet Program (ABP) is being carried out by BSNL through Project Implementation Agencies (PIAs), while monitoring and validation are undertaken by Independent Engineers (IEs) appointed by BSNL. All network design and rollout frameworks are also being finalised by BSNL.

As ABP is a brownfield project, certain aspects of the rollout require special attention, one of the most critical being the conduct of the physical survey and the finalisation of the BOQ.

Accordingly, this SOP attempts to set a structured survey and validation process with clear roles for the PIA, IE and BSNL field officers. It prescribes scenario-based guidance, digital evidence and a transparent system of ascertaining the BoQ.

This SOP is just guidance/procedure and doesn't give any relaxation against RFP, if anywhere there is difference between this SOP and RFP that RFP will prevail. Same may be reported back.

2. Step 1: BSNL Provides Information of Existing Network

2.1 BSNL shall provide baseline documentation block-wise, including:

- As-Built Document (ABD) / Route Index Diagram (RID)
- GIS mapping (KML files) of OFC routes on existing BSNL NIC GIS Platform
- BSNL NIC GIS Platform access to be given to PIAs

2.2 These datasets form the reference base for desktop planning and survey validation.

3. Step 2: Desktop Planning by PIA

3.1 The PIA shall prepare optimal ring route plans basis based on inputs provided by BSNL on GIS-based planning tool.

3.2 Planning shall prioritise:

- Shortest/Optimal route selection for techno-commercially viable ring formation
- Utilisation of existing OFC network
- Optimal use of street furniture in case of aerial roll out
- If a GP is nearer to an adjacent block and technically feasible, include it in that block's ring instead of its administrative block ring to reduce fibre length and cost.

For e.g., If GP-1 in Block-1 is 2 km from Block-2 ring and 7 km from Block-1 ring, it may be considered for connection to Block-2 if technically viable.

- Depending on the non-feasibility of the ring architecture deployment, PIA may recommend to BSNL to deploy suitable network architecture (linear) other than ring architecture in a GP/ GPs. If ring architecture is not techno-commercially feasible, BSNL shall approve the same based on the recommendation of the PIA and IE on case-to-case basis. [ref. ABP PIA RFP – Sec IV B – 3.5(d)]

4. Step 3: IE Validation of Desktop Plan.

IE shall validate the desktop planning through digital tool

5. Step 4: Physical Survey by PIA &BoQ Submission

(Basis IE approved Desktop Plan)

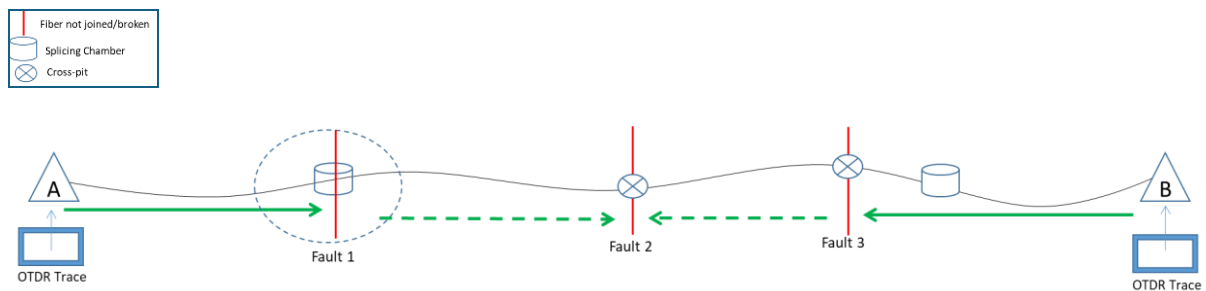
5.1 Greenfield Network

- a) The survey is conducted by PIA field staff using a motor vehicle and a mobile application with an integrated GIS interface.
- b) The surveyor follows the Desktop Plan approved by the IE and uses the mobile device to record the route video.
- c) Whenever there is a need to deviate from the approved or proposed route, the surveyor records the specific reason for deviation and the details of the new path. These deviations are geo-tagged on the GIS map for later validation by IE.
- d) During the survey, all crossings such as roads, railways, canals, and utility lines that may require Right of Way (RoW) permissions are identified and recorded with coordinates.
- e) Prominent landmarks such as culverts, electric poles, bridges, village entry points, and government buildings are also recorded on the GIS map.
- f) All digital information captured in the aforesaid process is transferred and stored without any transposition or manual intervention, and available for record purposes.
- g) The PIA submits to the IE the BoQ in the prescribed format (Annexure-I). Along with the BoQ, the PIA uploads a digital evidence pack in the PM Tool (BSNL) / S-NOC Tool, including:
 - KMZ files
 - Route videos and photographs (timestamped and geo-tagged)
 - Before submission, the PIA provides a self-certification confirming the correctness and completeness of the BoQ and evidence pack.

5.2 Brownfield Network

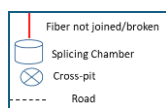
- a) The survey is conducted by field staff using a motor vehicle and a mobile application with an integrated GIS interface.
- b) The surveyor follows the Desktop Plan approved by the IE and records the route video on the mobile device
- c) The personnel involved are the PIA survey team, BSNL official, and the IE member.
- d) The surveyor takes OTDR readings from both OLT and progresses chamber-by-chamber until route completion. If chambers are not available, cross-pitting is carried out.
- e) Cross-pits are excavated where required. At each fault location, mandatory digital records are captured including OTDR trace, DGPS coordinates, depth photographs, joint photographs, and videos.
- f) Before jointing, OTDR is repeated to check for further faults, after which splicing or jointing is carried out using low-loss methods.
- g) Core-level fibre inventory is updated in the mobile app, and all evidence is uploaded to central storage.
- h) All digital information captured in the aforesaid process is transferred and stored without any transposition or manual intervention, and available for record purposes.
- i) The fault detection is handled case-wise as follows:

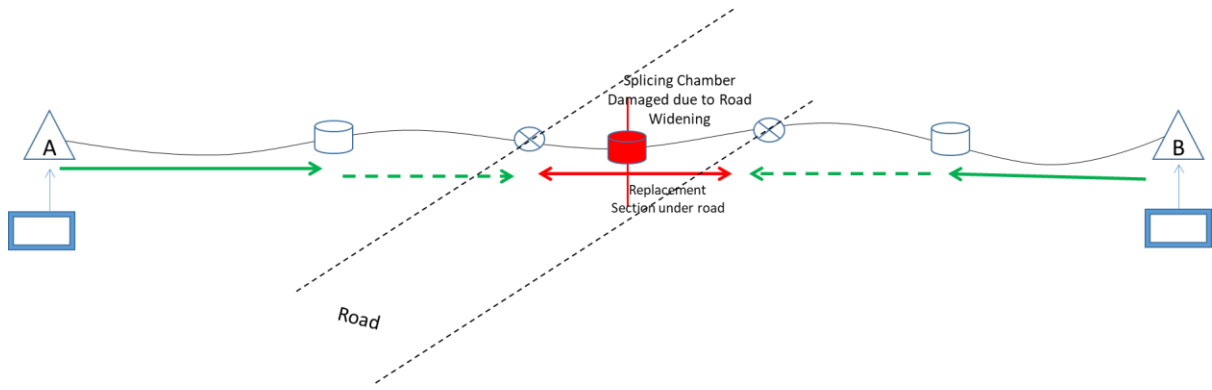

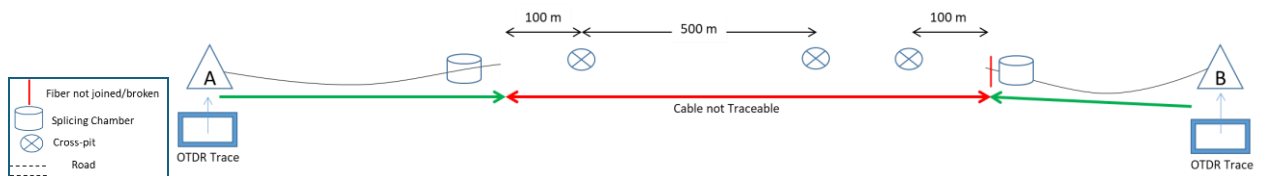

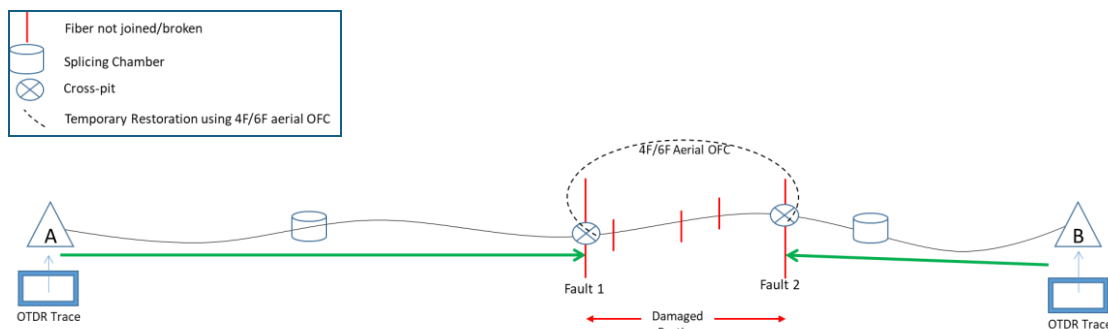

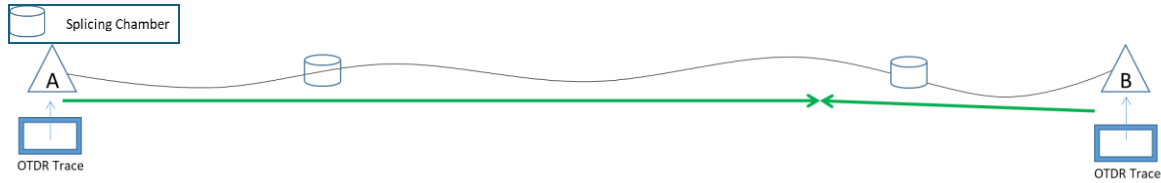

- j) The PIA submits to the IE the BoQ in the prescribed format (Annexure-I). Along with the BoQ, the PIA uploads a digital evidence pack in the PM Tool (BSNL) / S-NOC Tool, including:
- KMZ file of the surveyed route
 - Route videos and photographs (timestamped and geo-tagged)
 - OTDR reading photos (timestamped and geo-tagged)
 - Before submission, the PIA provides a self-certification confirming the correctness and completeness of the BoQ and evidence pack.
 - The PIA also provides justification note for any change in quantities compared to desktop plan.

It is further clarified there will not be any duplicacy of cable on same route/road (even on both side of road) except in very exceptional case of being that part near to Block HQ and ring entry to Block HQ is possible through one road only for which approval will be given by PGM/GM (Bharatnet) Cleary mentioning the justification,

6. Step 5: IE Validation

6.1 Greenfield Network

- a) The IE validates the BoQ and the digital evidence pack submitted by the PIA in the BSNL PM Tool.
- b) The IE confirms that all data has been uploaded without any transposition or manual intervention, and that records are complete and traceable.
- c) All recorded crossings such as roads, railways, canals, and utility lines are reviewed to confirm that RoW requirements have been correctly identified.
- d) If digital evidence is incomplete, or the proposal is techno-commercially unviable, IE records observations in the BSNL PM Tool and returns the BoQ to the PIA for rectification.
- e) If validated, the IE forwards the BoQ to BSNL for final approval.
- f) BSNL either approves the BoQ or, if issues are identified, returns it to the IE with observations.

6.2 Brownfield Network

- a) The IE validates the BoQ and the digital evidence pack submitted by the PIA in the BSNL PM Tool, ensuring it includes OTDR traces and DGPS coordinates of cross-pits and fault points.
- b) The IE confirms that all data has been uploaded without any transposition or manual intervention, and that records are complete and traceable.
- c) For every replacement or repair IE will justify the same referring PIA justification.
- d) All replacement of existing cable IE team has to physically visit that section and give justification of replacement.
- e) The IE verifies that any changes in quantities compared to the Desktop Plan and as well proposed quantity as per RFP are accompanied by proper justification from the PIA.
- f) If digital evidence is incomplete, justifications are inadequate, or the proposal is techno-commercially unviable, the IE records observations in the BSNL PM Tool and returns the BoQ to the PIA for rectification.
- g) If validated, the IE forwards the BoQ to BSNL for final approval.
- g) BSNL either approves the BoQ or, if issues are identified, returns it to the IE with observations.

By following this process, a consolidated digital evidence trail will be created on a GIS map through multiple validation layers. Each layer reinforces the others, ensuring that faults and replacements are fully verifiable. Integrated into BSNL PM TOOL, this digital record becomes both a live reference for approving current BoQ quantities and a durable archive for future inspections, audits, and network maintenance.

AND:

Preamble

WHEREAS the Principal intends to award, under laid down organizational procedures, contract for

WHEREAS, to meet the purpose aforesaid, both the parties have agreed to enter into this Integrity Pact the terms and conditions of which shall also be read as integral part and parcel of the Tender Documents and contract between the parties.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF MUTUAL COVENANTS STIPULATED IN THIS PACT THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS AND THIS PACT WITNESSETH AS UNDER:

SECTION 1 – COMMITMENTS OF THE PRINCIPAL

1.1 The Principal commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles:

- a. No employee of the Principal, personally or through family members, will in connection with the tender for or the execution of the contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for self or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which the personal is not legally entitled to.
 - b. The Principal will, during the tender process treat all bidder(s) with equity and reason. The Principal will in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to all bidder(s) the same information and will not provide to any bidder(s) confidential/additional information through which the bidder(s) could obtain an advantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.
 - c. The Principal will exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.
- 1.2 If the Principal obtains information on the conduct of any of its employee, which is a criminal offence under IPC/PC Act if there be a substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the Chief Vigilance Officer and in addition can initiate disciplinary action as per its internal laid down Rules/ Regulations.

SECTION 2 – COMMITMENTS OF THE BIDDER/CONTRACTOR

- 2.1 The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) commits himself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption. He commits himself observe the following principles during the participation in the tender process and during the execution of the contract.
- a.  - d. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) of foreign origin shall disclose the name and address of the agents/representatives in India, if any. Similarly, the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) of Indian

Nationality shall furnish the name and address of the foreign principals, if any.

- e. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will, when presenting the bid, disclose any and all payments made, are committed to or intend to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.
- f. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not bring any outside influence and Govt bodies directly or indirectly on the bidding process in furtherance to his bid.
- g. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or to be an accessory to such offences.

SECTION 3 – DISQUALIFICATION FROM TENDER PROCESS & EXCLUSION FROM FUTURE CONTRACTS

- 3.1 If the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s), during tender process or before the award of the contract or during execution has committed a transgression in violation of Section 2, above or in any other form such as to put his reliability or credibility in question the Principal is entitled to disqualify Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) from the tender process.

The exclusion will be imposed for a period of minimum one year.
- 3.3 The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s)with its free consent and without any influence agrees and undertakes to respect and uphold the Principal’s absolute right to resort to and impose such exclusion and further accepts and undertakes not to challenge or question such exclusion on any ground including the lack of any hearing before the decision to resort to such exclusion is taken. The undertaking is given freely and after obtaining independent legal advice.
- 3.4 A transgression is considered to have occurred if the Principal after due consideration of the available evidence concludes that on the basis of facts available there are no material doubts.
- 3.5 The decision of the Principal to the effect that breach of the provisions of this Integrity Pact has been committed by the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) shall be final and binding on the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s), however the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) can approach IEM(s) appointed for the purpose of this Pact.
- 3.6 On occurrence of any sanctions/ disqualifications etc arising out from violation of integrity pact Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) shall not entitled for any compensation on this account.

- 3.7 subject to full satisfaction of the Principal, the exclusion of the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) could be revoked by the Principal if the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) can prove that he has restored/ recouped the damage caused by him and has installed a suitable corruption preventative system in his organization.

SECTION 4 – PREVIOUS TRANSGRESSION

- 4.1 The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) declares that no previous transgression occurred in the last 3 years immediately before signing of this Integrity Pact with any other company in any country conforming to the anti-corruption/ transparency International (TI) approach or with any other Public Sector Enterprises/ Undertaking in India of any Government Department in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process.
- 4.2 If the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or action for his exclusion can be taken as mentioned under Section-3 of the above for transgressions of Section-2 of the above and shall be liable for compensation for damages as per Section- 5 of this Pact.

SECTION 5 – COMPENSATION FOR DAMAGE

- 5.1 If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) from the tender process prior to the award according to Section 3 the Principal is entitled to forfeit the Earnest Money Deposit/Bid Security/ or demand and recover the damages equitant to Earnest Money Deposit/Bid Security apart from any other legal that may have accrued to the Principal.
- 5.2 In addition to 5.1 above the Principal shall be entitled to take recourse to the relevant provision of the contract related to termination of Contract due to Contractor default. In such case, the Principal shall be entitled to forfeit the Performance Bank Guarantee of the Contractor or demand and recover liquidate and all damages as per the provisions of the contract agreement against termination.

- 8.3 The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) accepts that the Monitor has the right to access without restriction to all product documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s).
